

SUMMARY OF GUIDELINES FOR SEEDCORN GRANT APPLICATIONS

Eligibility and Remit

We welcome applications for seedcorn grants. These grants are designed to pump-prime early stage research to generate preliminary data that can be put towards future funding proposals. We are keen to support innovative and novel ideas related to prevention, diagnosis and/or treatment of human diseases. We encourage applications with 'out-of-the-box', potentially transformative ideas. Applicants are expected to have a novel and innovative hypothesis and some preliminary data that can be developed further. We will prioritise funding of applications that we believe have the greatest potential to secure further funding and grants. We will consider both pre-clinical and clinical research studies.

- We will consider applications from first-time or more junior principal applicants, however, we recommend that a more experienced co-applicant is included as part of the team. For all applications, the principal applicant must confirm that they will be employed at the host institution for the duration of the project.
- If you are applying for additional funding from other sources, we will only release our funding on receiving confirmation that the additional funding has been secured.
- Please note that seedcorn funding cannot be used to fund the stipend or consumables for PhD studentships.
